### News from the GSA Board of Trustees

- At its September 1<sup>st</sup> Board Retreat, GSA's trustees endorsed a comprehensive "vision statement" detailing how GSA might more fully achieve its mission. *Getting there* will be a work in progress, requiring thoughtful, strategic planning, and along the way there will undoubtedly be revisions and refinements. - GSA Trustees will vote on the budget at the Board meeting October 22. After that, the budget summary will be posted on the website at <u>TownTuitioning</u>.
- GSA's Board of Trustees will have the first of its three annual public meetings on **Tuesday, October 25, at 5 pm at GSA**. The first part of the meeting will focus on the 2022-23 budget, and the second on GSA Vision 2022.

## Campus News

- We are introducing a Community Service requirement for all GSA students. Students will have the opportunity to complete some of their service during school sponsored events along with participating in projects/events outside of GSA.
- GSA Day is back! There is a long-standing tradition of seniors hiking together up Blue Hill Mountain in the fall. At the summit they met with a member of the Blue Hill Heritage Trust to learn more about the organization and how they impact our community. In addition, seniors discussed how they can support their communities. In conjunction with the senior hike, GSA day was an opportunity for 9th 11th grade students to complete service projects and connect with each other while supporting the Blue Hill Community.
- We are thrilled to welcome fourteen boarding students this year from eight countries (Afghanistan, Austria, China, France, Mexico, Spain, Ukraine, and the United States).

# From GSA's Advancement Office

A Celebration of Giving/Annual Report is on its way to print presently with many more details, but here is a brief summary of 2021-22 fundraising results:

- The total raised 2021-22 was \$638,228, a 45% increase over last year. This includes \$293,299 to the GSA Fund, a 15% increase over last year.
- Special gifts & initiatives:
  - o \$22,900 for our steel drum initiative, which enables GSA to have its own instruments and expanded programming
  - o \$51,376 to endow a new college and career counseling fund
  - o \$22,867 in support of current use and endowed Food for Thought funds
  - o \$25,000 in support of future facilities campaign objectives
  - o \$5,750 raised by alumni volunteers for GSA's Alumni Sports Fund
  - o \$113,463 in support of scholarships for GSA seniors
  - \$52,430 to endow a scholarship in memory of Deborah Brewster
- Development Committee: Trustees Amy Baker and Prudy Heilner, and community members April Chapman '91, Margie Gray '81, Christine Wanning, Lynne Yarusko, Sarah Clapp '02, Mary Tobey '93, and Carrie Clifford '94.
- Advancement Committee: Trustees K. Guinness, Sara Becton Ardrey, and Sally Mills '85, and community members Phyllis Taylor, Joyce Snow, and Larry Flood.

### Facilities updates

- Supplemental tuition has enabled us to address several critical, immediate facilities needs. Projects already accomplished this summer include replacing the sewage pump, replacing one boiler and repairing two others; re-roofing the Butler Building; replacing the arsenic filters in the water system; adding a new single-occupant bathroom to the Academy Building. The McIntyre Building and front of the Academy Building have been repainted, and we plan to put a new roof on the McIntyre Building. The roof of the Academy Building is scheduled to be replaced this fall.
- Using other monies we upgraded the WiFi infrastructure to improve both safety and learning: new security cameras have been installed and connectivity has been upgraded to better serve the entire campus.
- As is true every summer, the gym floor has been resurfaced and the classrooms deep cleaned prior to student arrival.
- A master plan for the critically necessary comprehensive campus revitalization over the next ten to twenty years has been in exhaustive development for the past several years, and is in the final stages of review by Trustees and Staff and will be ready to be shared more widely in the near future.
